Futura is the top of the line, available in the popular 2-door and now in a new 4-door, both displayed here. Or consider the standard Fairmont, 2- or 4-door, if what you have in mind is excellent style and value at a very low price. And there's the Fairmont station wagon, which has the best fuel economy ratings, the highest cargo capacity and the lowest sticker price of any mid-size wagon built in America.

All Fairmont models are well appointed and equipped, as the standard features listed on page 17 clearly point out. Especially notable are these: new low rolling resistance P-metric steel-belted radial tires, maintenance-free battery, high-illumination halogen headlamps (Futura), and Ford's new Limited Corrosion Perforation Warranty (explained on the back cover).

Your wide choice of options (pages 18-19) includes the new Tu-Tone paint treatments shown here—a distinctive scheme for each body style. Fairmont's power train alignment gets an exciting boost from two new optional engines—the 4.2 liter (255 CID) V-8, and the only 4-cylinder turbocharged engine built in America. The 2.3 liter turbo is discussed in some detail on page 5.

And Fairmont has more Better Ideas, the kind that make its design so sensible for today. Like the confident feel of the road you get from the modified MacPherson strut front suspension, 4-bar link coil spring rear system, and rack and pinion steering. Trim, aerodynamic exterior styling. A remarkably spacious interior, plus a roomy trunk. And best of all, excellent fuel economy from the standard 2.3 liter OHC 4-cylinder engine with 4-speed synchronized manual transmission. EPA gas mileage ratings for this power team, shown below, are higher than last year.\* If you choose the optional 3.3 liter (200 CID) "I" Six, you have the best estimated mpg of any 6-cylinder mid-size car.

Fairmont Futura, in either sporty 2-door or new 4-door luxury model, has the unmistakable look that marks it as the top-of-the-line Fairmont.

Futura's beautifully appointed exterior includes such standard features as dual rectangular halogen headlamps, hood ornament, bright belt moldings, deluxe vinyl insert bodyside moldings with integral wheellips, plus stylish turbine wheel covers. Futura 4-Door has dual remote control mirrors as well.

You can make your Futura even more stylish. With bodyside accent stripes and bright window frames, you have the exterior features of the optional Futura Decor Group presented here on our display model (add dual mirrors also to Futura 2-Door).




- (A) Futura 2-Door with Decor Group in Silver Metallic (1G) with Black half vinyl roof and turbocharged engine. The unique wrapover roof pillar design is Futura 2-Door's most distinguishing feature.
- (B) Futura 2-Door with Sport Group in optional Tu-Tone White (9D) over Candyapple Red (2K). Sport Group includes over-the-roof tape stripe, here in Candyapple Red, and charcoal/ argent grille. This car is also equipped with the optional turbocharged engine.
- (C) Standard 2.3 liter OHC 4-cylinder engine offers excellent fuel economy, higher even than last year.\* With 4-speed manual transmission; optional SelectShift automatic available.
- (D) 2.3 liter turbocharged engine delivers plenty of reserve power on command for passing or freeway merging. The turbocharger consists mainly of a turbine and a compressor. The turbine, driven by exhaust gases, connects to the compressor, which pressurizes the fuel/air mixture and increases its velocity to the combustion chambers. This simple principle produces great results.
















Futura's handsomely trimmed interiors provide a distinctive atmosphere of personal comfort and convenience. Your choice of seating arrangements begins with sporty bucket seats or a bench seat, standard, depending on the power team (see note below), and moves up to the elegant flight bench seat in the optional Decor Group. Decor bucket seats are also available. And you can select any one of six attractive colors: Medium Red, Medium Wedgewood Blue, Caramel, Medium Vaquero, Sand or White. Bucket seats in optional plaid cloth/vinyl shown in (B) are available in Medium Red, Medium Wedgewood Blue or Caramel.

- (A) Futura Decor Group—Cloth Flight Bench Seat. A top-line Futura exclusive, this luxurious flight bench seat has smooth velour bodycloth, shown in Medium Vaquero (YZ) with Cordovan luxury velour cloth inserts. It's also available in pebble-grain vinyl. Or, to combine sportiness with luxury, choose bucket seats in the Decor velour cloth trim. Other features you get in the option group include: luxury steering wheel, special sound insulation package, plush passenger compartment carpeting, carpeted luggage compartment, cloth headlining and sun visors (vinyl with White interiors), plus a passenger side visor vanity mirror, glove box lock, cigarette lighter and rear seat ashtray.
- (B) Futura Interior Standard Cloth/Vinyl Bucket Seats. Standard bucket seats are shown here in optional Wedgewood Blue plaid cloth and vinyl (UB). The pebble-grain vinyl in (B), page 14, is standard. Futura's interior offers these features as well: padded upper door trim panel with woodtone inserts and carpeted lower portion, color-keyed deluxe belts, full-width high-gloss woodtone appliques on the instrument panel, and deluxe steering wheel hub.
- (C) Futura Interior—Standard Cloth/Vinyl Bench Seat. In new "double-bucket" sew style, this bench seat is standard with optional Six and V-8 engines (see note below). Available in optional knit-weave cloth and vinyl trim, here in Caramel (ST). Comes in the pebble-grain vinyl shown in (B), page 14.

Note: Standard seating in Futura is determined by your choice of power team. You get (1) low-back bucket seats with the 2.3 liter engine/floor-mounted 4-speed manual transmission, and with the 2.3 liter turbo engine/floor-mounted automatic transmission; or (2) bench seat with the optional 3.3 liter (200 CID) "I" Six/floor-mounted 4-speed manual overdrive, and with the 4.2 liter (255 CID) V-8 engine/column-mounted automatic. Bucket seats are available as an option with the Six and V-8 engines.

In the Decor interior, the flight bench seat is available with optional column-mounted automatic only. Bucket seats are available with either manual or automatic floor-mounted transmission, and also with the column-mounted automatic.

The 2-door and 4-door standard Fairmonts are high on everything except price. High on style and value, they are at the same time very affordable. Here they are shown with the distinctive Exterior Accent Group: bright belt moldings, wheellip and rocker panel moldings, bright LH mirror, hood ornament, deluxe wheel covers, and bright window frames (available separately). Just the right accents to highlight Fairmont's clean, sculptured lines.

Fairmont offers more than good looks, of course. Fairmont is trim outside, surprisingly spacious inside. It's aerodynamically designed to reduce wind resistance. And you get such features as modern P-metric steel-belted radial tires and maintenance-free battery in the long list of standard equipment on page 17. Plus Ford's new Limited Corrosion Perforation Warranty explained on the back cover.

What's more, excellent fuel economy is one of Fairmont's Better Ideas for the 80's. A 2.3 liter OHC 4-cylinder engine is standard, with EPA fuel economy ratings that are even higher than last year.\* With optional turbocharger, the 2.3 liter engine delivers extra power on command for passing or freeway merging. It's the only 4-cylinder turbocharged engine built in America.

The standard Fairmont is practical, well equipped—and very affordable. And with emphasis on space and fuel efficiency, Fairmont's design is right for the 80's.

There is more to a Fairmont than meets the eye. Inside, you may feel as though you're in a larger car. It's designed to be trim and compact, but there's room enough inside to comfortably seat five. Notice the large glass area—it adds considerably to Fairmont's roomy, inviting atmosphere.

You have fine engineering in Fairmont. Better Ideas for the 80's like the modified MacPherson strut front suspension, 4-bar link rear system, plus rack and pinion steering. Most important for today, the standard 2.3 liter OHC 4-cylinder engine with 4-speed manual transmission gives excellent fuel economy, even better than last year.\*

Among many other Better Ideas is the optional 2.3 liter turbocharged engine, available with floor-mounted automatic transmission. For more information on this remarkable engine, see page 5. Your choice of Fairmont power teams also includes the optional 3.3 liter (200 CID) "I" Six with 4-speed manual overdrive transmission. It gives Fairmont the best fuel economy estimates of any 6-cylinder mid-size car. And there's the new 4.2 liter (255 CID) V-8 available with automatic transmission.

- (B) Fairmont 2-Door with ES OPTION in Tu-Tone Candyapple Red (2K) over Black (1C), available separately. Also equipped with optional 2.3 liter turbocharged engine. ES OPTION gives Fairmont the image of a European road car. It includes a black grille, cowl grille and lower back panel. Window frames are black, as are the functional rear pillar ventilation louvers, remote control LH and RH mirrors-all added features along with the black vinyl and bright bodyside moldings. You also get bright belt moldings, turbine wheel covers, and bumper guards with rub strips. ES OPTION comes with a sports handling package consisting of a larger front stabilizer bar, rear stabilizer bar, stiffer front and rear shocks and lower arm bushings, stiffer rear spring rates. Also included, P-metric 185/75R tires on 51/2-in, wide wheels.
- (C) Column-mounted 2-lever system on all Fairmonts puts controls at your fingertips. Windshield wipers/washers are operated with the front lever; turn signal, horn and headlamp dimmer with the rear lever.
- (D) ES OPTION interior features a color-keyed instrument panel with full-width grey engine-turned appliques (woodtone with optional Instrumentation Group). A metal-spoke sports steering wheel is included on the black column, too.





# FORD FAIRMONT ENGINEERING

## Here's where our Better Ideas for the 80's begin: AN INSIDE LOOK AT FORD FAIRMONT

Fairmont is designed and engineered to be comfortable, practical and efficient. Qualities all underscored by advanced technology and Ford engineering, with emphasis on Ford's Better Ideas for the 80's. The features highlighted here are but a few of the many reasons we feel you'll be pleased when you invest in Fairmont quality.

A. Modern Aerodynamic Design.
Aerodynamic efficiency, or low wind resistance, can help improve performance and fuel economy.

B. Positive Handling Suspension System. Fairmont was the first Ford car to incorporate the modified version of the MacPherson strut front suspension. The MacPherson system is used on many European luxury sedans. Rear suspension is the 4-bar link system used on some full-size Fords. Shocks are positioned vertically outboard of the rear rails for optimum ride control.

C. Economical 2.3 Liter OHC 4-Cyl.
Engine. Offers excellent fuel economy,
even higher than last year. (EPA gas
mileage estimates are shown on page 3.)
Features overhead cam design, HollyWeber staged 2V carburetor with
crossflow design of intake and exhaust
ports. Now available with optional
turbocharger, which provides extra
acceleration when you need it. For more
about turbocharging, see page 5.

D. Responsive Front Disc Brakes resist fade because they dissipate heat more effectively, are less affected by rain and dampness than drum brakes. Incorporate audible wear sensors.

E. Precise Rack and Pinion Steering.
A direct, low-friction system which provides steering response with minimal effort.

F. New P-Metric Steel-Belted Radial Ply Tires. Standard on all Fairmonts. Major feature is higher inflation pressure than last year, for reduced rolling resistance.

G. Fully Synchronized 4-Speed Manual Transmission. Companion to the standard 2.3 liter 4-cylinder engine. Fully synchronized to permit rapid upshifting and downshifting at moderate speeds without gear clash.

Includes sporty short-throw shift lever.
Shown in illustration is the optional
SelectShift automatic transmission,
which lets you go fully automatic or
shift manually.

H. Spacious Interior Design. Efficient use of interior space has made Fairmont famous. Fairmont's design offers generous room for five passengers plus 16.8 cu. ft. of trunk capacity, enough to hold 10 pieces of assorted luggage.

I. Solid Unitized Body Construction.
Fairmont's unitized body is a one-piece steel shell with smooth-fitting seams.
Front suspension strut attaching points and engine front mounting brackets are integral with fender aprons.

## Plus These Additional Features:

Column-mounted control 2-lever system. New halogen headlamps (Futura) and maintenance-free battery. Flat luggage compartment floor with spare tire stowed beneath. And more.

Low Scheduled Maintenance. The 1980 Ford Fairmont has a recommended maintenance schedule of 10,000 miles (7.500 miles with V-8 engines, 3,000 miles with turbo engine) or 12 months between oil changes and 30,000 miles between tune-ups and lubes. These are just two small parts of a comprehensive program which, in total, can lower scheduled maintenance to an estimated \$171 on the '80 Fairmont-73% or \$471 less than the comparable 1973 Maverick-over 50,000 miles. This example uses 3.3 liter Six engines and automatic transmissions in both cars. Ford Labor Time Standards, a \$21.35 hourly labor rate, and manufacturer's suggested retail parts prices effective July 1, 1979, were used in the above computations.
