

ENVIRONMENT AND FUNCTION

he term "ergonomics" has been used
more and more over
the past few years
with regard to automotive design. It refers to the
science of planning a vehicle's interior to best suit those
who will be occupying it.
Roominess, placement of controls, visibility — all are functions of ergonomics.

The 1989 Thunderbird has been ergonomically designed to put the emphasis on providing optimum driver and passenger room and comfort. Head room, shoulder room, hip room, leg room—all have been increased to create an interior compartment that's remarkably spacious. And there are convenient areas for storage thoughtfully placed in the doors and in the console.

AUTOMATIC SHOULDER BELT RESTRAINT SYSTEM

An automatic front shoulder belt restraint system is standard in all Thunderbirds. It automatically secures the front shoulder belts for the driver and passenger.

The motorized shoulder belt moves back and forth on a track located above the door. When a front door is opened, the belt is positioned forward at the front pillar and out of your way for entry. Once you're seated, have closed the door and turned on the ignition, the belt moves back along the track and across your chest and shoulder. Shoulder belt tension is automatically adjusted and allows freedom of movement. All you have to do manually is fasten your lap safety belt.

To release the system to exit, simply open the door and unfasten the lap belt. Also, there are emergency release buckles located on the motorized ends of the shoulder belts. Audible and visual signals alert you when one or both belts have been disconnected from the emergency buckles.

Thunderbird's automatic shoulder belt restraint system was thoroughly tested for your safety and convenience. But it's not intended to function alone. Use the system only in conjunction with the manual lap safety belt. For the rear seats, manual shoulder and lap belts are provided for outboard passengers and a lap belt is provided for the center position.



Convenient power windows are standard on all Thunderbirds. Controls are located in the door panel armrests for easy identification and comfortable operation. See page 27 for availability of dual electric remote mirrors and power door locks shown also.





ny description of Thunderbird LX would have to include a reference to luxury.

Above all, LX is outfitted for extraordinary passenger comfort and convenience.

The interior is the focus for LX premium appointments. The seats are trimmed in special cloth and the door trim panels are richly upholstered. The power driver's seat adjusts six ways. Both sun visors have a lighted mirror. Electronic instrumentation includes speedometer, tachometer and trip computer (detailed on page 8), and an instrument panel storage bin (located above the glove compartment) features a sliding lid to help keep valuables out of sight. The electronic AM/FM stereo radio includes a cassette tape player.

LX convenience equipment includes front seat reading lights, an engine compartment light, and front and rear courtesy lights. The illuminated entry system lights the interior when the door handle is lifted for extra security after dark. A vehicle maintenance monitor keeps track of fluid levels for oil, fuel, coolant and windshield washer and even indicates when the engine oil needs to be changed. The right and left outside rearview mirrors are power remote controlled.

Speed control and a tilt steering wheel, two very popular driver convenience items, are standard with LX. And the rack-and-pinion steering is "speed sensitive." A computer adjusts the amount of power assist to the exact requirements of the driving situation for smooth, low-effort steering in tight, low-speed maneuvers and a progressively firmer feel as speed increases.

Owning a Thunderbird LX

can be even more rewarding with Preferred Equipment Package 162A. It's a group of popular options with a substantial savings included in the price of the group. Front passenger power seat, premium cassette radio with premium sound, power antenna and the keyless entry system are some of the items included in this desirable package. THUNDERBIRD

hunderbird's new profile is eye catching, to be sure. But it's also functional, using sleek lines to achieve the benefits of aerodynamics so important in today's automobiles — lower wind resistance and improved handling. For this is a thoroughly contemporary Thunderbird, one that brings advanced technology to a long-respected nameplate and writes the latest chapter

in Ford design leadership.

Thunderbird's 3.8 liter V-6 engine features the precision and efficiency of a sequential electronic fuel injection system. Efficiency is also enhanced by the engine's roller tappets, whose low-friction operation contributes to fuel economy.* And lightweight, high-strength aluminum and magnesium components help give the vehicle a better power-to-weight ratio than typical materials.

The Automatic Overdrive transmission, with its improved highway fuel economy, is standard, along with the precision and ease of rack-and-pinion power steering. The suspension system, responsible in large part for Thunderbird driving pleasure, is discussed on the following pages.

Inside, five adults enjoy a measure of roominess that just may surprise them. The front bucket seats have individual recliners and the automatic shoulder belt restraint system (see page 8) helps make safety convenient.

Thunderbird comes equipped with standard features that add to the enjoyment of driving. Air conditioning is complemented by tinted glass all around. An electronic AM/FM stereo radio provides entertainment. Interval wipers and power windows make Thunderbird all the more pleasurable. And for outstanding Thunderbird value, Preferred Equipment Package 151A contains a group of popular options at an attractive price. Dual electric remote-control mirrors, electronic AM/FM stereo radio with cassette, speed control, tilt steering wheel, power driver's seat and power door locks are just some of the items. SUSPENSION AND BRAKING

ver the years,
Thunderbird
has come to
be known as a
"driver's car," regardless of model or series.
That's because it's been engineered with the kind of suspension system that appeals
to those who take driving a
little more seriously. The 1989
Thunderbird is no exception
with its rear-wheel drive contiguration and performanceoriented componentry.

The all-new suspension system combines a long-spindle. short/long arm (SLA) front suspension with a fully independent SLA in the rear (see below) for taut handling. Front and rear stabilizer bars provide added control. The rear suspension control arms are "double isolated" This isolation from both the subframe mounts and the lower control arm bushings helps reduce harshness. The front suspension strut is also double isolated for low harshness.

Thunderbird's shock absorbers contain a low-pressure charge of inert nitrogen gas. The gas suppresses foaming of the hydraulic fluid due to rapid bumps or similar agitation. This, with the help of variable-rate coil springs, means the ride is smooth under normal circumstances, yet firm enough for handling situations.


TECHNOLOGY AND BRAKING

Recent advances in automotive technology have meant new and effective ways to deal with out-of-the-ordinary driving situations. One of these beneficial developments is anti-lock brakes, which are standard equipment in Thunderbird Super Coupe and optional with the other Thunderbirds.

Hard braking can cause wheel lock-up which reduces driver control, especially on slippery surfaces. The computer technology built into the anti-lock brake system virtually eliminates brakeinduced wheel lock-up.

Electromagnetic sensors monitor the speed of each wheel during braking and transmit the data to a microprocessor. If impending wheel lock-up is detected, the brake pressure from the hydraulic unit to the wheels is modulated up to ten times per second. The brakes are applied and released repeatedly in the same way you were taught to "pump your brakes" when you felt a loss of traction. But the anti-lock brake system operates at a rate of speed far exceeding human capability, providing the driver a much greater degree of steering control during hard braking.

The system includes powerassisted 4-wheel disc brakes. 10.8" in diameter up front, 10.0" in diameter in the rear, these brakes have a total swept area of 357.4 square inches for quick stopping action and reduced fade under severe braking.









THUNDERBIRD SUPER COUPE

here's no disputing the obvious signals that say Thunderbird Super Coupe is all business, and the business is performance. At its heart is a power-boosting supercharger with intercooler that transforms the sequential EFI 3.8 liter V-6 engine into a power-plant capable of over 200 hp and 300 lbs.-ft. of torque (see page 20). The unique sound from under the hood

means there is something very special indeed about this Thunderbird.

Super Coupe's computercontrolled anti-lock system is combined with 4-wheel disc brakes. Its suspension electronically adjusts to changing vehicle and road conditions. The steering system is "speed sensitive" to deliver the proper feel for the driving situation at hand.

Wide 16" aluminum wheels come with Goodyear Eagle performance tires with an aggressive tread. The Traction-Lok axle automatically shifts some of the driving force, or torque, to the wheel with the most traction under adverse driving conditions like ice, snow or mud. Special articulated sport seats can be adjusted to their occupants and the instrumentation befits the high-performance machinery it monitors. Super Coupe performance is discussed in more detail on the

pages that follow.

SUPERCHARGING

raditionally, superchargers have been found only on the world's most specialized performance cars. Simply put, supercharging is a means to increase the output of an engine (its horsepower) by raising the pressure of the intake charge above atmospheric.

The effect of supercharging is easy to describe. Figuratively speaking, it adds cylinders. The exhilarating rush of power upon acceleration makes it very difficult to believe you don't have more of them. In the case of Super Coupe, the performance is what you would expect to experience with a big V-8. And yet, when cruising at a constant rate of speed, the supercharger bypasses and gives you the benefit of 6-cylinder fuel economy.* Here's how supercharging works

The greater the mass of the fuel/air mixture supplied to the cylinders, the more power-

ful the combustion stroke. A supercharger is a positive displacement pump that delivers this increased mass. Unlike a turbocharger, it works across a very broad range of engine rpm. The result is quick response even at start-up speeds without the "lag" associated with turbocharging.

Some systems, like the one in Thunderbird Super Coupe, carry this principle even further with a device called an intercooler. Located between


the supercharger and the combustion chamber, the intercooler lowers the temperature of the air passing through it, increasing its density — and thus increasing engine horsepower even more.

Superchargers (unlike exhaust-driven turbochargers) are mechanically driven by the engine's crankshaft to deliver nearly instantaneous response, the kind associated with larger displacement engines. The supercharger


used in Thunderbird is the Roots-type positive displacement. It delivers boost at lower compressor rpm and over a much broader engine-rpm range than some other types (those which rely on centrifugal force for compression, for example). And the special contoured rotor shafts mean smooth operation. It's a system well-suited to the kind of driving most people do — a combination of urban, suburban and highway travel.

In order to maximize the effectiveness of its supercharger, the 3.8L V-6 engine contains special modifications. Hypereutectic aluminum alloy pistons feature a high silicon content for added strength. The intake manifold is configured for the pressurized fuel/air mixture it receives. And high-performance, platinum-tipped spark plugs are designed to last 60.000 miles before replacement, minimizing maintenance service.

INSTRUMENTATION AND CONTROLS

ith an automobile as performanceoriented as Thunderbird Super Coupe, it shouldn't come as a surprise that most of the instruments are related to the engine (the supercharger boost gauge, for example), and that this instrumentation is comprised of real gauges, not lights. The Super Coupe instrument panel and surrounding controls were designed with the emphasis on the driving function. Gauges and dials are placed to be quickly and easily read, and knobs and push buttons are placed to be comfortably reached. It's all part of the ergonomic integrity of Thunderbird.


But functional doesn't necessarily mean plain or spartan. Instrumentation was designed for a bold, aggressive appearance in keeping with the look, capability and feel of the car itself.

Super Coupe's performance analog speedometer features white-on-black graphics and trip odometer. There's a tachometer, of course, and between the two are the supercharger boost gauge and fuel gauge. Temperature and oil pressure gauges are positioned at either end of the cluster. The air conditioning controls are arranged for convenient operation and feature clear graphics for easy reading.

The 5-speed manual transmission leather-covered shift knob is designed to be comfortable to grip and shift and the switch for the automatic ride control suspension (see page 24) lets the driver override the computer and initiate the "firm" mode when maximum handling is desired.

Included in the optional Super Coupe Special Value Package 157A is the electronic AM/FM stereo radio with cassette tape player which is located up high on the instrument panel for ease in changing radio stations or cassette tapes.

DRIVER INTERACTION



high performance driver knows that in addition to what is seen, important information about the road and the car is being fed back through the seat, the steering wheel and the foot pedals. In Super Coupe, some of this "input" is sensed by technologically advanced suspension, steering and braking systems that help the driver, car and road interact.

The computer-controlled "speed-sensitive" power steering system adjusts the power to the situation by responding to sensors which provide data on speed and steering angle. This results in smooth, low-effort steering in tight, low-speed maneuvers and a progressively firmer feel as speed increases.

AN INTELLIGENT SUSPENSION

Super Coupe's suspension system incorporates a microprocessor that monitors signals from speed, brake pressure, steering and acceleration sensors and adjusts shock absorber damping automatically to provide the optimum ride/handling to match the situation. Shock damping is "normal" for a smooth ride or "firm" when extra handling is required ("firm" mode may also be selected manually by means of a switch located on the center console). These sophisticated features, combined with the anti-lock braking system detailed on page 16. contribute to Super Coupe's extraordinary driving capability and exhilarating performance.

Super Coupe's articulated sport seats provide firm support and are bodycontoured to help hold you in place when cornering. They encourage the proper posture for driving comfort and command and include individual recliners for the driver and front passenger. The headrests adjust 4 ways: up/ down and tilt forward/back. To help keep the driver and front passenger firmly in place, the front seat backs have back bolsters which include an infinite power adjustment for individual comfort. The power lumbar support also adjusts to an infinite number of positions to fit the seat to the occupant as precisely as possible.


