

How far will Plymouth go to win you over? 5 years or 50,000 miles, to be exact.

Here's how Plymouth's 5-year/50,000-mile engine and drive train warranty protects you: Chrysler Corporation warrants, for 5 years or 50,000 miles whichever comes first, against defects in materials and workmanship and will replace or repair at an Authorized Plymouth (or Imperial, Chrysler or Dodgo) Dealer's place of business, without charge for required parts and labor, the engine block, head and internal parts, intake manifold, water pump, transmission case and internal parts (excluding manual clutch), torque converter, drive shaft, universal joints, rear axle and differential, and rear wheel bear-

ings of its 1967 automobiles, provided the owner has the engine oil changed every 3 months or 4,000 miles, whichever comes first, the oil filter replaced every second oil change and the carburetor air filter cleaned every six months and re-

placed every 2 years, and every 6 months furnishes to such a dealer evidence of performance of the required service, and requests the dealer to certify (1) receipt of such evidence and (2) the car's then current mileage.
